

## Assignments

Week 9, beginning 10/13/2008:

### Tuesday:

- Hand in your story rewrites on Thursday.
- We didn't get as far as I had hoped last week in your *Sentence-Combining Workbook* inasmuch as I had hoped we'd complete Unit 7. We'll work on this first, and I will *not* collect your workbooks today because I'm behind in my grading of papers – my English 2 students are patiently wondering when they will get their paper rewrites and journals back – and will instead collect your workbooks on Thursday, which means we can finish Unit 7 and maybe do a little of Unit 8 as well.
- I asked you to write a one page rough draft using one of the questions on pages 120 to 121. We'll take a look at these, and hopefully there will be a couple brave volunteers who will share their drafts with the class.
